4. A reading from the book of Psalms"

This is the true worship that you should offer. Do not conform yourselves to the standards of this world, but let God transform you inwardly by a complete change of your mind. Then you will be able to know the will of God- What is good and is pleasing to him and is perfect.

Do not think of yourself more highly than you should. Instead, be modest in your thinking, and judge yourself according to the amount of faith that God has given you.

Hate what is evil, hold on to what is good. Love one another warmly... and be eager to show respect for one another. Work hard and do not be lazy. Serve the Lord with a heart full of devotion. Let your hope keep you joyful, be patient in your troubles, and pray at all times. Share your belongings with your needy fellow-Christians, and open your homes to strangers.

Ask God to bless those who persecute you- yes, ask him to bless, not to curse. Be happy with those who are happy, weep with those who weep. Have the same concern for everyone. Do not be proud, but make friends with humble people. Do not think of yourselves as wise.

If someone has done you wrong try to do what everyone considers go be good. Do everything possible on your part to live at peace with everybody. Never take revenge... instead, as the Scripture says;

"If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him a drink". Do not let evil defeat you; instead, conquer evil with good. Romans 12

6. A reading from St Paul's letter to the Church in Colossae

You are the people of God; he loved you and chose you for his own. So then, you must clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Be tolerant with one another and forgive one another. Whenever any of you has a complaint against someone else, you must forgive one another just as the Lord has forgiven you. And to all these qualities add love..

Allow the peace Christ gives guide you in the decisions you make...

And remember to be thankful... Let everything you do or say be done in the name of the Lord Jesus, as you give thanks through him to God the Father.

7. A reading from St John's first letter,

Dear friends, let us love one another, because love comes from God. Whoever loves is a child of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. And God showed his love for us by sending his only Son into the world, so that we might have life through him. Dear friends, if this is how God loved us, then we should love one another.

No one has ever seen God, but if we love one another, God lives in union with us and his love is made perfect in us. We are sure that we live in union with God and that he lives in union with us, because he has given us his Spirit.

8. A reading from Paul's letter to the Church in Corinth:

If I had the gift of being able to speak in other languages without learning them, and could speak in every language there is in all of heaven and earth, but didn't love others, I would only be making a noise.

If I had the gift of prophecy and knew all about what is going to happen about everything, but didn't love others, what good would it do?

Even if I had the gift of faith so that I could speak to a mountain and make it move, I would still be worth nothing at all without love.

If I gave everything I have to the poor, and if I were burned alive for preaching the Gospel but didn't love others, it would be of no value whatever.

Love is very patient and kind, never jealous or envious, never boastful or proud, never haughty or selfish or rude. Love does not demand its own way. It is not irritable or touchy, It does not hold grudges and will hardly even notice when others do it wrong. It is never glad about injustice, but rejoices when truth wins out. If you love someone you will be loyal to them no matter what the cost. You will always believe in him, always expect the best of him, always stand your ground in defending him. Love never gives up. Its faith, its hope and its patience never fail. Love is eternal.

1 Corinthians 13:1-7

A Reading on Love

N. and M. are now married, but a marriage is never established in a brief moment of time. Rather it is built up over the years as two people grow together. More than that, it has to be worked at by the couple. In the process there are certain qualities to be cultivated that make for an enriching and lasting relationship. These have been expressed in the Christian tradition by the words of the Apostle Paul. His thoughts on love provide a sound foundation for the marriage relationship to grow and flourish. Listen to what he wrote:

'Love has good manners and does not pursue selfish advantage. It is not touchy. It does not keep account of evil or gloat over the wickedness of other people. On the contrary, it is glad... when truth prevails.

Love knows no limit to its endurance, no end to its trust, no fading of its hope; it can outlast anything. It is in fact, the one thing that still stands when all else has fallen.

In this life we have three great lasting qualities - faith, hope and love. But the greatest of them is love.'
